MAYOR'S MESSAGE

FINANCIAL BURDEN

In last week's column, I mentioned that an external review of City of Ryde's **Voluntary Planning Agreements** (VPAs) was conducted following the implementation of an Action Plan to rectify the improper transfer of \$95 million in funds from Restricted Reserves to the Ryde Central project and other accounts.

That review, which commenced in May 2023, investigated the financial implications and liabilities that VPAs imposed on Council, with findings presented to Councillors on 20 August 2023.

I should explain that these voluntary agreements allow developer contributions such as the dedication of land at no cost to Council, monetary contributions, any other material public benefit or any combination of these for a public purpose. Conducted by Nexia Australia, the review focussed on 17 VPAs that were either operating

and/or executed, with Council's Asset Management team determining that the annual maintenance and renewal costs of these agreements totalled \$4.1 million.

In addition to those costs, various VPAs require Council to fund the fit-out and operations of dedicated assets.

The most notable is a VPA executed in November 2018 with AMP Capital that requires Council to spend an estimated \$30 million to fit-out a library and creative hub at the Macquarie Centre. Annual operating costs of the library are estimated at \$1.7 million.

Council currently has no reserves set aside to fund those fit-out costs.

As a result of the findings, Council resolved at its September 2023 Ordinary Meeting to include the financial impact of the VPAs in its Long-Term Financial Plan and to set aside available funds for any operational and capital

costs required by these VPAs, in particular the Macquarie Centre VPA.

Along with the fall-out from the improper internal fund transfers, this imposes a significant financial burden on Council. We are committed to making good long-term strategic decisions that strengthen our financial position in the future.


