VALE EDNA WILDE OAM

City of Ryde has lost one of its most respected community members with the passing of former Mayor Edna Wilde OAM, who was a significant and inspirational figure in the Ryde local government area for half a century.

Mrs Wilde served as a City of Ryde Councillor for 34 years from September 1974 until September 2008. In 1980, she became the City of Ryde's first female Mayor and held that role on three separate occasions between 1980-1982, 1999-2000 and 2002-2004.

In 2000, Mrs Wilde was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia for service to local government and to the community of Ryde. A year later, she was awarded the Centenary Medal for her service as the first female Mayor of the City of Ryde.

Throughout her civic life, Mrs Wilde was a dedicated supporter of the local arts scene in the City of Ryde, both through her role as Chairman of the City of Ryde Eisteddfod and volunteering her time to serve in senior roles for many community organisations.

Applicant: Cottonwood Development Pty Ltd

Description: Demolition of existing structures, construction of two residential flat buildings being 19 and 21 storeys above a mixed-use podium. The development includes 255 apartments, 288 parking spaces and associated landscaping works. The proposal is classified as 'Nominated Integrated Development', requiring a referral to Water NSW, under Water Management Act 2000. The application will be referred to the Sydney North Planning Panel under the EP&A Act 1979 for determination as the development has an estimated development cost exceeding \$30M.

Submissions regarding the above application must be lodged no later than Sunday 8 September 2024.

Anyone may make submissions to Council. Submissions are required to be in writing. They should be addressed to the Chief Executive Officer and sent by post, email or delivered in person to the Customer Service Centre. A submission by way of objection should specify the grounds of objection. The City of Ryde has resolved that all submissions received in relation to rezoning and development applications will be publicly accessible on request. The supply of personal information is voluntary. However if you choose to make an anonymous submission it may be given less weight (or no weight) in the overall consideration of the application. Development Applications are available for inspection electronically and without charge at the Customer Service Centre, 1 Pope Street, Ryde (within the Top Ryde Shopping Centre) between 8.30am and 5.00pm Monday to Friday (2nd Thursday of each month – 10.00am to 5.00pm).
