CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

The City of Ryde honoured its 2025 Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year, Sportsperson of the Year, and Environmental Citizen of the Year at a special ceremony held at North Ryde Golf Club on 20 January. Along with a number of City of Ryde Councillors, I was excited to be

among the first to take a dip in this wonderful new Parramatta River site, which provides a much-needed place for our residents and visitors to cool down.

I can report that it was a highly enjoyable and refreshing experience. Putney Beach is free, the swimming area is netted, there's plenty of shade, and the steps to the water's edge provide easy access for everyone. Regular water quality testing ensures the beach is healthy and safe for humans, but Council advises people not to swim for three days after significant rain events. I'd like to thank the NSW Government for its Places to Swim grant, and to the Parramatta River Catchment Group, which has worked tirelessly to clean and protect this delicate ecosystem. I am hoping that scenic Putney Beach now becomes one of Council's must-visit destinations.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Signalisation of Constitution Road and Bank Street Intersection City of Ryde welcomes your feedback under Section 38C of the Roads Act 1993 on the upgrade works to the Constitution Road and Bank Street intersection.

The Constitution Road and Bank Street intersection, on the western side Waste, Recycling and the Circular Economy (Closes 23 February 2025) of Meadowbank station, provides important connections through the Meadowbank precinct to surrounding industrial, commercial, and residential areas. The upgrade of this roundabout to traffic signals delivers safety and traffic flow performance improvements, allows for future growth, and enhances the overall amenity of the road corridor. The upgrade involves:

- Removal of the existing four arm roundabout and replaced with traffic signals comprising:
 - Signalised pedestrian crossings across Constitution Road/ Bank Street and Meadow Crescent
 - Provision of a dedicated right turn into Meadow Crescent
 - Dedicated left and right turn lanes to be included out of Meadow Crescent
- Relocation of the Kiss and Ride facility on Bank Street, to the northern side of Constitution Road, near Bank Street
- Implementation of a "left-in left-out" arrangement into and out of Bank Street (north) adopting central median and associated line marking
