There are11 women and 9 men on that Council due to a quote system which applies for women, people with a disability and young people. Ryde will be hosting the LGNSW conference in 2024, She is looking for ideas about how to engage with participants, where can they stay, where can they eat etc. Sinclair also has Korean delegation attending the Northern Centre Is still trying to obtain funding to continue programs such as SafeT which has exceeded the number of clients expected to be seen Hopes to arrange a round table with relevant government ministers Noted that housing is a major issue at present Social housing blocks are proposed for West Ryde and Macquarie The working homeless is a group increasing in number.
